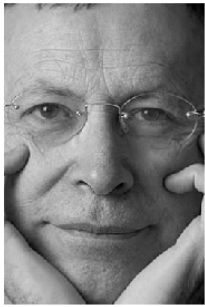
DAUGHTERS OF THE KING ANNOUNCEMENT

"The high priest of Bach" ~ Wynon Munnah

Anthony Newman, one of the country's leading organists, harpsichordists and Bach specialists, will present an afternoon of Bach to benefit Episcopal Community Services in observance of the 250th anniversary of the death of Johann Sebastian Bach.

For three decades, the multi-talented musician, conductor and composer has performed with major orchestras across the country as well as in London, Paris, Budapest, Vienna and Germany. A frequent guest with the Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center, Mr. Newman has recorded for Sony Classical and serves as Music Director for St. Matthew's Episcopal Church in Bedford, New York. His teaching career has included positions at the Juilliard School, Indiana University and SUNY College.

Long known for his commitment to persons in need, he is the founder and administrator of Hands On Outreach, an organization providing food to shelters and to the indigent, and is a member of Hospice, a national organization providing comfort to those who are mentally ill.

The concert will be free of charge with an opportunity to make a donation to Episcopal Community Services, an organization serving the poor and needy in the Diocese of San Diego. Performance time is 4PM on Sunday, February 21, 2010 at St. James by-the-Sea Episcopal Church, located at 743 Prospect Street in La Jolla.
